

Hi everyone,

Most of you received an e-mail from me last month about the Barrington Natural Heritage & Agricultural Fair, except a few whose e-mail addresses I apparently had entered incorrectly. Today I'm writing to provide a few details and a reminder about the musical part of the Fair.

It's happening this Saturday at the Warren Farm in Barrington. The Fair goes on from 10:00 - 4:00, and features a variety of interesting events, including a Farmer's Market, a variety of crafts, entertainment (Rebecca Rule will be there, which should be fun!), farm animals, musicians - oh - that's us!

It should be a fun day, and the music should make it more so. Teresa and I are hosting a fairly informal traditional music group from 10:45 - 1:00; presumably we'll take breaks during that time. We would like to invite anyone who is interested to join us. I'll bring my keyboard along, and make it available, play it at least part of the time if no one else wants to.

We expect to play a mixture of New England, Canadian and Swedish fiddle tunes, and whatever else anyone is interested in. I've assembled a basic tune list we can use for ideas, but we don't have to stick to it at all times. There should be opportunities to play together as a full band; but also for individuals to play their favorite tunes, or perhaps for small groups to play tunes together. I've volunteered to call a couple dances if there's interest, so I may ask the band to play for a dance or two at some point. If you've been to the Canterbury Fiddler's Picnic it will probably bear some resemblance other than being a part of a larger event.
